Qualifications at the Associate Professor level include a MD or equivalent with five to ten years training or experience in Palliative Medicine or special competency in one of the Oncology disciplines (or equivalent) and commensurate evidence of successful teaching and graduate supervision, evidence of established academic engagement in professional and other communities, and eligibility for licensure in the Province of Alberta.

Qualifications at the Professor level include a MD or equivalent with more than ten years training or experience in Palliative Medicine or special competency in one of the Oncology disciplines (or equivalent) and commensurate evidence of successful teaching and graduate supervision, evidence of established academic engagement in professional and other communities, and eligibility for licensure in the Province of Alberta.

The Calgary Zone comprises four teaching hospitals situated in the city of Calgary, and serves residents of southern Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan. Calgary is a vibrant, multicultural city (population ~1.2 million) near the Rocky Mountains, Banff National Park and Lake Louise.
